The Annual Member and Business Meeting of the North Dakota Hospital Association (NDHA) was called to order at 2:24 p.m., Central time, in Bismarck, ND on October 4, 2022, by Tim Blasl, NDHA President. A quorum of members was not present.

Reports:

- Mr. Blasl gave a legislative update including the 2021 Special Legislative Session.
 - Mr. Blasl reported on new initiatives of NDHA including the creation of a health benefits trust for members; the creation of a Telehealth Committee; and new leadership and nursing education conferences put on by NDHA in 2022. Mr. Blasl also reported regarding new directors elected to the NDHA Board of Directors.
 - Mr. Blasl presented reports on the current status of Hospital Solutions, Inc., (HSI); the North Dakota Hospital Foundation; and the Health Benefits Trust.
 - Mr. Blasl reported on 2022 NDHA state PAC contributions.
 - Callen Cermak, NDHA Finance Manager, presented the NDHA 2022-2023 fiscal year budget.
 - NDHA Health Benefits Trust Administrator, Aaron Brennan, reported on current activity of the Health Benefits Trust.
 - Mr. Blasl and Melissa Hauer, NDHA Vice President and General Counsel, gave a legislative report regarding the platform for the upcoming 2023 legislative session.
 - Elizabeth Summy, AHA Regional Executive, Region 6, reported on the current focus of the American Hospital Association (AHA) includes financial stability for

- hospitals, workforce, health equity, behavioral health, 340B drug pricing program, hospital worker violence and cybersecurity.
- Eric Rasmussen presented a federal legislative report including American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) leftover funds, 340B drug pricing program enforcement by the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA), Medicare sequester, the Hospital Outpatient Prospective Payment System (OPPS) increase, and the CMS proposal to establish a Rural Emergency Hospital category.
- Anna Walter, Project Coordinator, University of North Dakota Center for Rural Health, provided a report regarding the North Dakota Rural Health Clinic Network which can provide technical assistance and education to Rural Health Clinics including a virtual library and compliance webinars.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 4:04 p.m., Central time.
